

Objectives:

- **1. To explore Children's Rights.**
- 2. To understand everyone has the same rights.

You will need:

Paper, scissors, decorating materials and colouring supplies: felt pens/crayons/pastels/ pencils.

Length: 40 Minutes

Content	Activity	Time
Introduction	 The Convention on the Rights of the Child is a list of rights specifically for children adopted by every country in the world except for the United States, Somalia and South Sudan. The reason children have been given their own set of rights is because they are especially vulnerable to not having their human rights respected. 	5 mins
Video	Watch the 6 minute <u>video</u> on The Convention of the Rights of the Child.	8 mins
Discussion	Ask children which rights they think are most important and why?	5 mins
Activity (Art)	 Hand out paper and ask children to outline their hands and cut them out Ask children to choose a right to put on their hand Decorate hands Printout the globe below and ask children to stick their hands around the globe. 	15 mins
Discussion	 Why are rights important in their lives? Why are they important to children around the world? Remind children that no matter how different children may look on the outside, their rights are all the same. 	7 mins
At home	Ask children to talk about the activity at home and ask family members which right they think is most important.
